FIRST CHURCH BUILDING COMMITTEE UPDATE

In an effort to keep everyone informed of our progress on the First Church Building Project, here is the latest update:

- The six dormers are now framed and weather-tight;
- The addition to the rear of the building is enclosed and the back fill is being brought in;
- The retaining wall footing is complete and the concrete for the wall was poured on Tuesday, August 21st.;
- A contract has been signed for the removal of three additional trees to insure the safety of the building and bike path;
- The building committee met on Monday, August 13th as scheduled. In addition to hearing a very detailed summary report from Jim and reviewing our expenses with Peg Nicholson's and Don Aukamp's input, committee members walked through the building and were amazed and delighted at the progress. It is so exciting to see ideas that were on paper come to life!
- The site is secure and extra neat which is a mark of the diligence of Delphi, our contractor.
- The next FCBC meeting will be on Wednesday, September 12th, 5PM.
- The next Vestry meeting on Monday, September 17th will include a tour of the site. Please arrive at 4:30PM. No open-toed shoes, flip-flops or sandals!

NEW PARISH AND COMMUNITY CENTER - *Capital Campaign Update*

In terms of the campaign itself, as previously reported, the pre-project costs plus the actual contracts total about \$2.3 million and that is our revised campaign target. We expect that the furnishings, some excluded elements of landscape and hardscape and lumber price escalation will bring the total cost to \$2.5 million, so that is our stretch goal. With \$1.6 million from Phase 1, we are pleased that against the Phase 2 goal of \$700,000, we now have commitments exceeding \$400,000 bringing the overall campaign total raised to date to over \$2 million.

We continue to develop our campaign outreach to the community, foundations, and grant sources and continue to send out update letters and a new brochure with campaign materials. As progress becomes ever more visible at the construction site, we expect new interest, excitement and support!

We welcome your questions and suggestions. We are deeply grateful to all who are supporting this project that is central to effective service to the parish and to providing new opportunities to the wider community.

- 1,146 unduplicated households received food;
- 1,319 unique adults ages 18-64,
- 579 children under 17

- 394 seniors
- 14,803 bags of food were distributed to these individuals during ALL visits between January 1 and June 30, 2018.
